- Remember that joy fuels sustainability



Artificial Intelligence (AI) can save Lions leaders time each month by helping with different Club tasks but with so many AI options available, how do you choose the right one?

AI chatbots can help your club:

- Draft newsletters and press releases
- Create recruitment emails and membership surveys
- Build flyers and social media posts
- Organize service project plans
- Summarize meeting notes
- Generate fundraising ideas
- Answer frequently asked member questions

For busy Club officers—President, Secretary, Membership Chair, Zone Chair—AI can become a reliable administrative assistant.

Start with your Club's needs.

If you mainly want help writing newsletters, speeches, and promotional materials, **ChatGPT** is a strong all-around choice. If your officers work primarily in Word, Excel, and Outlook, **Microsoft Copilot** integrates directly into those tools. Clubs using Gmail and Google Docs may prefer **Google Gemini** for its built-in collaboration features.

Lion AI at www.lionsclubs.org also provides Lions a quick, personalized assistance and streamlined access to what you need, and it starts with **Ellie**, an AI assistant for all things Lions International. Whether you have a question about a program, need to find a specific resource or just want a recommendation, **Ellie** is there to help Lions. Keep in mind that **Ellie** is still learning, and work continues to make it even better over time so it can create an even better experience for you.

Most platforms offer free versions to get started, with paid plans typically costing around \$20–\$30 per month. For many Clubs, even one shared subscription can significantly reduce administrative workload.

A few important reminders:

- Do not enter sensitive member or financial information.
- Use AI for drafting and planning — not record storage.
- Start small and expand as your officers grow more comfortable.

AI won't replace leadership, service, or the heart of a Lion but it can free up time so we can focus on what matters most: serving our communities and growing our Clubs.







LAWRENCE COUNTY LIONS CLUBS REACH NEW MILESTONE RECYCLING OVER 96,000 EYEGASSES AND 1,790 HEARING AIDS

Across our country eyeglass and hearing aid wearers have millions of old unwanted eyeglasses and hearing aids stashed throughout their homes in drawers. Simply donating these old specs and aids to a local Lions Club can become a very special way of recycling and at the same time greatly change the quality of life for a needy person. These used eyeglasses are repaired and distributed at no cost by the Lions Club Collection Centers (eyeglasses) to help underprivileged people in need in many developing countries and Lions Club Loaner Program (hearing aids) for repair and distribution to needy people living in Indiana.

The Bedford Lions Club started this collection project in 1980 and has collected a total of 73,396 pairs of eyeglasses and 971 hearing aids with all the other Lions Clubs in Lawrence County joining to help in the recycle effort. The Bedford Noon Lions Club started in 2002 and has collected a total of 13,706 pairs of eyeglasses and 689 hearing aids. The Mitchell Lions Club started in 2006 and has collected a total of 6,718 pairs of eyeglasses and 78 hearing aids, and the Fayetteville Community Lions Club started in 2010 and has collected a total of 2,950 pairs of eyeglasses and 59 hearing aids.

The Lions Clubs would like to thank all the businesses, churches, eye doctors, libraries, and organizations for their support of our ongoing collection project. The Lions could not have had such a successful project without their cooperation in placing the collection boxes at their locations for the community to drop off their used eyeglasses and used hearing aids. We would also like to thank all of the people who donated these eyeglasses or hearing aids to support this recycle program and help many people with vision or hearing problems improve the quality of their lives. There are now over 30 locations in the Lawrence County area where used eyeglasses and hearing aids can be dropped off so please find one or just give them to any Lion you know and help the Lions help people in need.

Harrison County Lions Clubs Volunteer with Love the Hungry

On Saturday, February 21 over one hundred volunteers gathered at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church and School in Lanesville to package nutrient-rich meals through Love the Hungry, a non-profit based in Louisville which works to end hunger worldwide. Members of several Harrison County Lions International Clubs were a part of that effort, providing fourteen volunteers from the Corydon, Lanesville, and Ramsey clubs. It was a productive day as over one hundred boxes of meals were packaged in less than two hours.

St. John's Church has hosted many of these events over the years, as representatives from Love the Hungry presented church members with an award showing that a total of over 200,000 meals have been prepared during their volunteer events.

Love the Hungry, started in 2012, is a faith-based group working to provide nutritious meals to those in need. The volunteer packaged meals feature the Nutri-Plenty packet, a blend of twenty-one vitamins and minerals designed to address malnutrition in children. The packages also contain dry-vegetable and soy protein mixes. When used the only thing which needs to be added is boiling water. The meals are shipped not only to developing countries such as Kenya and Jamaica, but meals were sent to eastern Tennessee following hurricane Helene in 2024. Each year at least ten percent of packaged meals are provided in the Kentuckiana area.

Lanesville Lions Club Treasurer Sarah Whitely said, "It was so much fun joining forces with St. John's Church to help Love the Hungry provide meals for those far away. The work we did will provide over 21,000 meals to children in need in Kenya. We were happy to be contacted about this opportunity to volunteer!" Edgar Thornton, a member of the Ramsey Club added, "It was great to see such enthusiasm, especially as the Lions motto is, "We Serve!"

There are several Lions Clubs in Harrison County in addition to the Lanesville, Corydon, and Ramsey clubs. It is the world's largest service club organization with over 1.4 million members worldwide. Local clubs volunteer with vision care, speech, and hearing screening projects, mental health, hunger and disaster relief, and seeing eye dog efforts. Most of their efforts specifically benefit Harrison County, such as supporting the Harrison County Community Service organization, and offering post-secondary education scholarships to local high school graduates.


